Eco-cement project

It was a pleasure to meet with you during my visit to Tasmania in December last year.

As mentioned at our meeting, I am very interested in developing a program based on the EcoTech technology for productive use of fly ash from power generation activities.

Japanese power companies are facing new challenges for cleaner production under the Kyoto Protocols for greenhouse emissions. Over the past twelve months my team in Invest Australia Tokyo has been regularly visiting the top nine Japanese power producers, major trading companies and major industrialists to discuss "greenhouse investments". We have successfully concluded four deals that are related to greenhouse issues.

An issue that was mentioned several times was the productive use of fly ash from energy production. Currently, some of the Japanese power companies are simply dumping fly ash that is added to their cost of production. Interest in this type of technology was reconfirmed by several of our clients during a recent tour of Japan to promote greenhouse investments.

Invest Australia makes no assumptions as to the uptake of your technology in Japan. However, as mentioned above, I would like to have information to distribute to our major power industry clients to test their level of interest.

I hope that we can work together on this.
